Real Case of *Jelina Materu

Year 2000

Jelina became pregnant by a classmate at secondary school. His family rejected her and she was no longer allowed to attend school. She gave birth to the child and suffered a stroke in the same year. The physical impairment and the fact that she was a single mother made it difficult for her to work. Relatives of hers helped her for a short period of time.

Jelina married her husband in 2002.

They had three children together. Their income came from selling clothes and sheets. It was their own little business. They looked after, and cared for each other.

In 2020, with the death of her husband, Jelina lost the capital of their business due to the hospital costs. Her children could no longer attend school because Jelina didn't have enough money for the uniforms, books and daily meals. Everything revolved around survival and covering the basic needs for her and the four children.

We met Jelina in 2023 living with three children in a room that she hasn't been able to pay for months. Her youngest son is physically disabled and is completely reying on her. Jelina herself has physical paralysis, which is the result of her stroke. Still has she been full of hope and confidence that she would find a way to raise her children, give them a chance for education and lead them out of their current difficult life situation.

August 2023: Kipepeo Family Foundation supported Jelina's idea of using bananas to generate her own money. She contacted her grandparents' village and now orders bananas from their farm every week and sells them at the market in Moshi. With the income of her banana business she can pay the children's schoolfees again and has enough left to pay the rent, next to the basic needs of her family.

GO 2 SCHOOL WITH KIPEPEO

Aim is to ensure that children from disadvantaged families have the opportunity to receive an education without being completely separated from their carers. Parents should still be able to take full responsibility for the upbringing of their children by providing a safe home, shelter, food, medical care and clothing.

The Kipepeo Family Foundation offers the following assistance:

- Support with primary school enrolment
- Obtaining a birth certificate if this is not available
- Educational counselling, support for young people
- Financing of school and training costs
- Support with the organisation and resolution of conflicts that may arise at school

As previous mentioned in the news of June 2023 have many of the last boys group been able to embark on a new path for the future.

Reunification with their families and the opportunity to get an education and start training has already been possible for 10 out of 15 boys.

Thanks to the teamwork of Kipepeo and the courage of the children themselves. Their path that is no longer defined by the street!.

We are happy to receive financial support for the new group now. Our fundraising on Thereforyou is still open until 31 January 2024. The money will be used exclusively for the work with the children living on the street.

We currently meet twice a month with the new boys as a group for a dinner together. dinner together. The focus is on building relationships, social work and mutual trust. Some of them would already like to be accompanied by us individually.
